What are our problems?

- The collective is getting bigger
- Ideological foundation of free software is not enough on which stands PPP, it has also its own boundaries and issues we would like to point and cover
- PrePostPrint could become a technical knowledge base only, as technical discussions often cover more fundamental direction. This is a problem for some members.
- The objective(s) of the collective are still blurry and requires being clearly stated somewhere
- Is it possible everybody is not on the same vibe? Is there a common projection, if yes, what is it?
- Are the previous questions for maintainers only?
- Decentralization → guidelines?
- What are obligations of maintainers? Keep PPP on track, following political orientation, or only maintain tool?

The PrePostPrint collective was inspired by the free software movement, conceptual, technical, and esthetical experiments in the publishing and typographic field, and a wish to collaborate, meet and build collectively.

The cultural context of the PrePostPrint initiative, takes its roots following non-exhaustive scenes: fanzine, auto-publication, DIY, hacker manifesto, Libre Graphics Meeting, Velvetyne, Constant, OSP, the Internet folklore and personal pages, net art, creative coding...

Our web to print and alternatives approaches to publishing are rooted in a desire to lead a struggle against the toxic powers of big technical infrastructures. If we have adopted the tools and practices of free and opensource software, it is to rely on their capacity to be studied, hijacked, reappropriated and shared, and beyond that, on their emancipatory power, their ability to challenge the oppressive powers (capitalist, patriarchal, extractivist, colonialist...). We are developing technicalities and practices that are part of the history of user-friendly (aka convivalist, *conviviaux*) tools, tools "at the service of all the members of a community, and not at the service of a body of specialists", that "engender neither slave nor master" (Illich).

The PrePostPrint collective is getting bigger since two years, with the new dynamics and discussions tools such as the active Mastodon account, the matrix channels, wiki and the human networks. That is for the best.

But this change can blur any political statements and context that helps to draw the directions of the collective.

To prevent the collective to be picked up or rerouted by bigger energies (corporations, politically unaligned initiatives), we suggest writing a statement that would be directly visible on the website.

- What are people's interests to be part of PPP
- How can such a statement can be built collectively? What methods exists to do so?
- How can such a statement remain clear, simple, open but engaged enough?
- How not to be only technical? And a technical forum? Should we share more "political statements" AND "artistic statements" ?
- Put a license on the wiki? What license? CC4r? despite it not being a real license ← Could we/you augment this argument? Not only on what would be a "real" licence, but on how CC4R wouldn't be a good path to follow.

1. Political base

How to set a base? I got mine. Not everyone would agree. Who will / how to decide and set the final cut?

We take a resolutely political approach to the use of digital technologies. We recognise the toxicity of their ecosystems, and understand the mechanics of opression that underlie them

and that they perpetuate. We share common values based on [ok, go!] anti-capitalism, trans*feminism transitudes (to include trans masculinities and non binaries), ecology, antifascism, and the hope that we can help address these issues together.

As designers, publishers and artists who regularly manipulate digital tools, we are aware that these technologies are mainly at the service of capitalist, colonialist, patriarchal or climate-destroying logics and that they maintain a perspective of growth for the sole benefit of the most fortunate and the best born. We refuse to see this as inevitable and want to put our knowledge and findings at the service of [a better world :].

2. Opensource and beyond

We are deeply rooted in the free software movement and want to build on its foundations. If we have adopted the tools and practices of FLOSS, it is to rely on their capacity to be studied, hijacked, reappropriated and shared, and beyond that, on their emancipatory power, their ability to challenge the oppressive powers.

We believe that free software as defined by the majority of current licences is not enough. We are attentive to the legal and conceptual explorations involved in writing licences that go beyond the free/non-free binarity and seek to be part of a positively emancipatory struggle.

We are developing technicalities and practices that are part of the history of user-friendly (aka convivialist, *conviviaux*) tools: "at the service of all the members of a community, and not at the service of a body of specialists", that "engender neither slave nor master" (Illich).

3. Experimental approaches

We're looking for both new and old ways of doing things. We enjoy developing and using tools that are inefficient, bizarre or incongruous. We believe in serendipity and failure, in amusement and pleasure <3. While digital tools enable us to automate processes, we seek to put them at the service of invention, imagination and the happy surprise.

4. Sharing is caring.

As teachers, students, researchers, learners, we know the power of sharing knowledge, questions and experiences. We hope that the use of the resources we share will also be shared, if not documented. We believe that that discussion, sharing knowledge and material improve individual thoughts and production, and the tools we make <3. We believe that reciprocity in sharing is accessible regardless of the technical complexity or graphic quality of a project.

We had before a first inquiry/collaboration with LGM association, when Julie Blanc one of our member had the opportunity to organize a Workshop using "CSS to Design books" at the 2019 LGM edition. The same year in Sarrebruck, Ana Isabel Carvalho & Ricardo Lafuente talked about the bridge between Open Design & Libre Graphics, while being precautious on the use of specific terminologies within the obvious and precious bound merging Graphic design and Open Libre movement alongside [Maybe Cite OSP article Wrote by Manetta <3]. Ana & Ricardo ended their conference with an unresolved question, Libre Design or F/LOSS design, which term do we set down on ? Manetta member of OSP and PPP proposed us to respond to your call for participation, and it is because we represent an ongoing reflexion in the Libre Graphics realms, that our presentation appeared as necessary and pertinent work, especially through the manifesto process.

Furthermore, our presence within Unix and Web2print cultures is in fact what bring us closer to what LGM is enabling, and has already enabled in 2019 as we saw above. Another shared interest from LGM finding a great echo within our discussion: enabling users and developpers to communicate. To established a fruitful exchange with the ones who build applications and the ones who used them, we are with ppp's website, matrix, ppp's index, both users and developpers. We aim to lay the path for people to use our tools as a single entity, a tool with well-defined purpose, convivial use and design complying towards the end user. While still letting doors open to the ones who desire to join us in the more prototypal projects where in-depth knowledge is needed. Hence why, in spite of a scale that is our own, and production where the outcome are, books, leaflet, webpages and web blog articles, printing tools, libraries, interfaces [quote fun prototypes]. However all of the above is the result of human relationship in a fun, and serious fun as Paula Sher defined. A community, where politics still matter, with policies for the people and by the people, a special care for representation.
